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The Wayang Golek Wooden Puppetry

Give students a wonderful insight into the myths and legends of Indonesian history and culture. The stories are presented through wooden puppet dolls in colourful costumes who serve as symbols of Indonesian art. Features the Hindu folklore 'The Legend of Ramayana and Mahabharata".

The Wayang Kulit Shadow Puppetry

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A theatrical shadow play based on the Hindu folklore 'The Legend of Ramayana and Mahabharata". Students are given an opportunity to watch the shadow puppetry from both sides of the screen to experience the magic behind this ancient art form.

The Wayang Kulit Half Day

Sumardi will guide students to make their own shadow puppets. The students will learn about the usage of specific characters and colours, as well as their symbolic meanings.

Aboriginal Infusion

Aboriginal Infusion is highly interactive and engaging introduction to the rich, continuing traditions and cultural aspects of Australia's First Peoples, such as dance, didgeridoo, artefacts and storytelling.

Please note: the exact aspects explored in this program will depend on the presenter.

Aboriginal Storytelling through Art

Aboriginal Storytelling through Art teaches students traditional symbols for people, the land and animals, assists them to create their own story using the symbols and techniques and invites them to present their stories to the group. This creative intercultural workshop is great for any age.

Polynesian Infusion

Participants will be transported to the Cook Islands with a traditional dance performance, interactive workshop and fast-paced combination of music, dance, storytelling and craft by performers skilled in drums, ukelele, chanting and more. Includes a hula dancing lesson!

Taiko Drumming

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This traditional and original Japanese music program combines amazing performance and interactive workshops. Students are introduced to Japanese culture through music and language, before the room shakes with the sound of the Taiko drums!

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Bollywood Infusion

Bollywood is an important part of modern Indian culture, referring to the Hindi film industry, and categorised by colourful displays of music, dance, and costume. Participants will learn about the folk and classical origins of the Bollywood dances, the symbolism of some of the steps, and a short routine to Bollywood music.

Indian Instrumental Infusion

Indian Instrumental Infusion engages participants with Indian classical and contemporary music through significant instruments, including the tabla and bansuri. The program is delivered by passionate musicians wholeheartedly committed to their art.

Rhythm of Nepal

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Nepalese-born Dheeraj is recognised as the foremost Tabla player in Australia. The Tabla is the quintessential percussion instrument of the Indian subcontinent and one of the most complicated drums to play. The Nepalese percussion instrument, the Madal, is the backbone of Nepalese folk music and is often played while hiking in the mountains of the Himalayas!


Indonesian Infusion

This program will take participants on an immersive and interactive journey, showcasing the amazing diversity of Indonesian places and culture through customs, language, dance, traditional dress and music.

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Chinese Drumming

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The earliest known drums in China date back to four thousand years ago! A performance of rhythm and colour, students will love this handson Chinese Drumming workshop as they drum out beats and learn about instruments behind the popular Lion Dance and Kung Fu soundtracks.

Chinese Lion Dance

Signifying good fortune, prosperity and longevity, the Chinese Lion Dance is an artform dating back to the 12th century! This engaging dance workshop will give students an opportunity to see the lions up close while gaining an insight into one of China's oldest traditions.

Chinese Martial Arts

Martial arts, also traditionally known as wŭshù in Mandarin, are art forms dating back more than 4000 years ago. In Chinese Martial Arts, a high energy educational workshop, participants get to delve into the history and philosophy of martial arts in China as well as trying out different styles such as Tai-Chi for themselves.

Vietnamese Classical Dance

Predominantly performed during Lunar New Year and Mid-Autumn Festival, Vietnamese Classical Dance has been an innate part of Vietnamese culture since ancient times; dating as far back as 600BCE! Traditional dance in Vietnam represent the harmony of Vietnamese cultures and the people, and can take many forms such as Fan Dance, Hat Dance, Lotus Flower Dance and Umbrella Dance.

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Cool Capoeira

Originating in Brazil as a martial art disguised as dance, Capoeira has UNESCO intangible cultural heritage status. Students will learn acrobatic manoeuvres accompanied by the beautiful sound of the berimbau musical instrument. Capoeira is for all, whether you are more an acrobat, musician, singer, dancer or martial artist.

Fire of Flamenco

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Fire of Flamenco incorporates dance, music and singing and has a rich, multicultural history influenced by Roma, Arab, West African and Spanish cultures. In this program, students will get to try the accompanying 'palmas' (clapping) and learn some flamenco dance moves.

Viva Mexico: A Cultural Journey

In Viva Mexico – A Cultural Journey, our presenter performs with instruments including the Mexican harp, Mexican and Spanish guitars, violin and trumpet. Students will learn folk dances and the meaning of Spanish lyrics found in popular songs. The presenter will explain the cultural history of the instruments and the Charro suit worn by the Mariachis.

Music of the Andes

Participants will explore the music and dances of the Inca culture from the Andes Mountains. Students will learn about traditional instruments and melodies that have been part of the Andes for generations, providing an opportunity to understand the region's traditions and history.







Latin American Dance

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Explore the vibrant world of Latin American dance through an engaging demonstration of salsa, cha-chacha, merengue, bachata, and tango. Discover the rich cultural significance of these dances as participants gain a deeper connection to the rhythms and traditions of Latin America.

Hip-Hop Infusion

In this high-energy interactive program, students will learn about hip-hop and urban dance culture around the world. Using a variety of super-danceable beats that will have all students up and dancing, this is the perfect introduction to the expressive world of hip-hop!

Songs of Italia

Singing in English and Italian, the presenter will take you on a journey, exploring over 600 years of Italian folk music. She delves into how people expressed their lives through song and how these styles differ between region, time, and language.

East Africa Meets Greece

East Africa Meets Greece is an engaging program that explores the cultural traditions of both regions. The session highlights the connections and contrasts between East African rhythms and Greek melodies, offering participants the chance to discover how music and dance reflect cultural identity. ۲

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Vietnamese Classical Music

The presenter will introduce learners to the T'rung (ancient Vietnamese bamboo xylophone) and an assortment of other traditional instruments, through performance, cultural stories, and interactivity! The participants will be exposed to these impressive instruments as they give voice to the beauty of Vietnamese Classical Music and traditions.

Thai Infusion

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Students will experience the enchanting sounds of traditional Thai Fiddle like the Saw Duang and Saw U, Bamboo Shaker and Thai Hammered Dulcimer, paired with the grace and beauty of Thai classical dance. Students will get to try elegant dance movements that reflect the harmony and rhythm of Thai life.

Middle Eastern Drumming

Drumming and rhythm are an integral part of Middle Eastern Cultures and the foundation of Belly Dance. In Middle Eastern Drumming, students will experience vibrant and unique Middle Eastern rhythms and learn about their origin and influences. Atman will present several types of drums and instruments and students will try playing themselves.

Africa meets the Middle East

Africa meets the middle east is an engaging program that explores the musical traditions of both regions. The session highlights the similarities and differences between African and Middle Eastern rhythms, instruments, and beats, offering students the opportunity to learn about the key elements that shape different music styles.







Rhythms and Instruments of West Africa

In Rhythms and Instruments of West Africa, the musical cultures of West Africa are explored through rhythms and songs from Ghana, Guinea and Senegal. Students will be introduced to a range of instruments such as the djembe, dun dun drums, shekere, talking drum, balafon and more!

Songs of Uganda

The presenter begins by performing traditional songs in the Baganda language accompanied by the Bakisimba dance and Kidigida rhythms. Students accompany Joseph by singing and learning the rhythms and Songs of Uganda. Instruments used include Engoma (drums), Endingidi (tube fiddle), Amadinda (xylophone) and Adungu (harp).

Balkan Beats

Embark on a musical journey to Southeastern Europe with an interactive music program suitable for all ages. In Balkan Beats, students can use whatever percussion instruments they have available – Darabuka, Djembe, Bendir, or just clap their hands! As they learn the rhythms of the Turkish and Bulgarian dancers and Macedonian maestros.

Les Chansons Francaises

Martial arts, also traditionally known In Les Chansons Françaises, Pauline shares stories of her Parisienne childhood in an interactive vocal session with songs that explore intercultural understanding. Students will hear and speak French throughout Les Chansons Françaises and end the session learning to waltz!

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Living Culture Tanzania

The creative and cultural industries in Tanzania are on the rise. According to a 2015 United Nations Conference on Trade and Development report, creative goods & services exports from Tanzania have risen from US\$2.46 million in 2003, to US\$69.92 million in 2012. Yet government funding towards these industries is still lacking substantially. The relationships between culture, employment and education, if supported, can help Tanzania's young people secure jobs and survive in the workforce. The Living Culture Program helps address this gap through the private sector.

Living Culture Zanzibar

Our Local Development Coordinator Natalie Denmeade has done extensive research on Zanzibar as the heart of the ancient Silk Road, and her findings have been imparted to the performance team so that they may brainstorm ideas on how to tell the rich story of Zanzibar through music and dance. Storytelling is important to the primarily oral literary culture of Tanzania, also reflected in the nation's growing film industry which has been affectionately dubbed "Swahiliwood"

Living Culture Pakistan

Pakistan has experienced significant liberalisation in the past decade which has helped increase its standing on the international stage, and has encouraged the nation to focus on improving gender equality and the integration of women as productive members of its workforce. Our efforts have largely focused on complementing the country's increased commitment to women's empowerment. The program also resonates with Pakistan's ongoing discourse of cultivating its "soft image".
